First E-LSA Course at Oshkosh

Having received acceptance from the FAA for its Repairman (LSA) I n s p e c t i o n -

Airplane Course, EAA SportAir Workshops announced its first scheduled session for July 8-10 at EAA headquarters in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Successful completion of the course will allow a person to perform the annual condition inspection on any Experimental-LSA (E-LSA) airplane they own.

WINGS TO ADVENTURE

The award-winning EAA Television department has been busy the past several months shooting Wings to Adventure, an aviation series set to premiere this month on The Outdoor Channel 2HD, its new high definition channel. The program will also air on TOC's regular cable channel for those who don't receive HD programming, and EAAAirVenture visitors can catch a special viewing on July 30 at Theater in the Woods.

GA FLIGHT OPERATIONS RESUME AT REAGAN NATIONAL

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) formally announced today that an interim final rule will be published in the next several days authorizing resumption of limited, tightly screened general aviation flight operations at Washington's Reagan National Airport for the first time since the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. Department of Homeland Security Deputy Secretary Michael Jackson, FAA Administrator Marion Blakey and TSA Administrator David Stone briefed a select group of aviation associations and other interested parties concerning today's formal announcement that cracks open the door to limited GA operations, after 3 1/2 years.

PROHIBITED AREA ESTABLISHED OVER BANGOR SUB BASE

Despite prolonged, strong appeals by aviation and pilot organizations, the U.S. Navy formally changed the temporary flight restriction located over the U.S. Naval Submarine Base in Bangor, Washington, into a permanent Prohibited Area, ironically coded "P-51".

Vickers Vimy Returns to Oshkosh En Route Europe

A lumbering, massive airplane made a return visit to EAA

headquarters last week for the first time in four years. A replica of the Vickers Vimy World War I bomber, which thrilled thousands of aviation enthusiasts at EAAAirVenture Oshkosh 2001, landed for an overnight stop at Pioneer Airport before continuing eastward to recreate history's first nonstop trans-Atlantic flight next month.

HISTORIC AIRVENTURE 2005 EVENING PROGRAMS

A truly historic schedule of evening programs will provide thousands of AirVenture attendees and campground residents with spectacular entertainment at EAAAirVenture Oshkosh 2005's Theater in the Woods. Among those scheduled to appear are Burt Rutan and Mike Melvill of White Knight/ SpaceShipOne fame; actor and pilot Harrison Ford, Chairman of the EAA Young Eagles Program; Steve Fossett, world record-setting pilot of the Virgin Atlantic GlobalFlyer; Will Whitehorn, President of Virgin Galactic who's working to get a space tourism business off the ground; Scott Crossfield, legendary test pilot who will appear with Melvill early in the week; Peter Diamandis, Chairman of the X Prize Foundation and the Zero-Gravity Corporation; and Bob Cardin, man behind the resurrection of the P-38 Glacier Girl.

EAA KIDVENTURE TURNNG SEVEN

EAA KidVenture enters its seventh year at EAA AirVenture with many familiar activities plus a few new ones. As in past years, kids can build their own model rockets and balsa planes; fly in a high-tech flight simulator; build their own propeller; meet and hear aviation legends at the KidVenture Hero's Stage; and much more.

EAAAIRVENTURE MUSEUM DINO-SOAR! EXHIBIT

While the world of flight begins to see the innovations taking shape in aviation's second century, the EAA AirVenture Museum is also looking back - way back - to the first flying creatures in a new exhibit that opened on Saturday, May 21st. "DINO-SOAR!" digs into the very origins of flight, from the earliest flying insects and reptiles, and connects them to aviation today. The highly interactive exhibit includes artifacts and models ranging from the evolution of dinosaurs into birds that inspired modern-day aviation

May 12th - Reid-Hillview Terminal Building

President Jon Garliepp called the meeting to order at 7:36 PM. The minutes from the General Meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer Randy Wilde received a billing from Jon Garliepp for supplies needed for the upcoming YE Flights at South County Saturday. Randy explained that Wolfgang Polak had previously submitted a bill for the "invitation cards" sent out to prospective EAA Chapter 62 members. It was reported that we did get one person at the last meeting who responded to receiving one of our cards. It is hoped that others may still come to later meetings as a result of the invitation cards sent out. Randy also explained that he deposited 645 dollars last Friday. Randy forecast that the next month's Chapter income should be better. The April 30 financial paper was distributed to all present. Please see the website for all the details.

Jon reported that he received a request from EAA to verify that V.P. Brian Dal Porto is a tech counselor. Jon verified same.

V.P. Dal Porto reported on upcoming programs. He said that Ed Rosiak will speak at the June meeting. July is still open. August will be member reflections of Oshkosh and September will be the report on the Air Academy. Brian submitted the paperwork for his daughter to Randy Wilde for the EAAAcademy. Randy said he would report that our candidate will be Brian's daughter, Mary Anne Dal Porto. Randy will also submit the paperwork for the EAAAir Academy.

Discussion was held concerning necessary time to depart RHV and materials needed to set up at South County for the YE Event Saturday. Allen Roark reported that YE pilots will also get free food. Allen indicated that the next YE Event will probably be June 18th at RHV. CH 338 will be having a display of their aircraft (7 - 8 aircraft) at that time as well.

Brian Dal Porto suggested we delay a Columbia flyin until sometime next Fall.

Jon reported that Jim Manley, our Newsletter Editor, called him the night of our General meeting and had just gotten out of the hospital with a broken bone in his leg as a result of an auto accident. Jon asked Wolfgang Polak to put out an emergency postcard to keep members updated on current events (i.e. Mike Studer's open garage May 21). It was generally agreed that getting out the Newsletter on time is one of the most important things determining the Chapter's success.

Wolfgang Polak, Webmaster, stated that he was trying out the new website adjustments he made to see if it works for all computers. So far it seems to be OK. He is still innovating.

Concerns were raised about how to get Chapter members together for camping, etc., at Golden West. Jon would like to set up along the taxiway and put our awning up with our planes behind it.

Meeting Adjourned at 8:45 PM.
