The Best Laid Plans of Mice and Men often go awry. (or I didn't know airplanes weren't plug-n-play!)

Having a plane is a great way to get away for fun events around Northern California. One of these events is the Booneville Fiber Festival. However, having a plane also brings it's own set of obstacles.

Saturday morning, we were all set to head off to Booneville, and we were even fairly on time. We taxied out to the run up area, and everything went smoothly until Brian tried to radio the tower to request permission to take off. No radio. From the time he had requested permission to taxi to the run up area to the time to take off, his radio decided that it didn't know which frequency it wanted to be on. There were offers of handheld radios, but loose objects in an open-cockpit plan don't quite mix.

Applicants Wanted:

An exciting opportunity is available to women who are interested in taking the first steps in learning how to fly. This fall, EAA will host the Coffy Gregory Aviation Program at the EAA Air Academy facility in Oshkosh.

Coffy Gregory, a long-time EAA member and aviation enthusiast from Rockford, Ill., was one of the first licensed female pilots in the country. Her vision and generosity has made this program possible.

The program consists of two parts. AeroScholars, a web-based curriculum that includes EAA's Fundamentals of Aviation course, which begins participants on their journey to take the FAA Private Pilot written test and earn two college-level credits. The second portion of the experience is an extended weekend residence program held in Oshkosh, featuring presentations and activities to further interest in pursuing flight.

Best of all, there are a number of full scholarships (valued at \$850) available directly through Young

Eagle Coordinators. Maybe a former Young Eagle has expressed an interest in learning to fly. Possibly one of your dedicated ground support crew is ready to pursue their dream of flight. You have a chance to help by nominating someone from your local area to attend the program.


The date of the resident portion of the program is from Friday afternoon, October 7 through Sunday, October 9, 2005. While attending the residence program, participants will enjoy a flight (weather conditions permitting) and begin working on the Aviation Fundamentals course with EAA mentors. In addition, sessions will be held with female leaders in the aviation profession.

Space is limited, so act quickly. This is an introduction to aviation class for women. To qualify, participants must be in the 10th grade and have not yet taken the FAA Private Pilot Written Exam.

Program registration includes participation in the web course and residence experience, including meals and lodging. Participants must provide their own transportation to and from Oshkosh. The closest commercial carrier airports are Appleton (ATW) or Green Bay (GRB) airports. EAA will provide shuttle service to and from these designated airports.

I can't emphasize the unique nature of this opportunity. Coffy Gregory knew the joy of flight and wanted to share her passion with future generations of women. Through her generosity, we can do just that. With your help, a group of deserving and enthusiastic women will follow in Coffy's footsteps.

GENERAL MEETING

Randy Wilde gave the treasurer's report after serving again as "Hot Dog Chairman" (aka "Bean Counter-Cooker") tonight. Randy indicated there were "no surprises" for August. The Education Fund received a generous donation from Gudrun and Wolfgang Polak of \$500. The "end of August numbers" can be found on the website.

Brian Dal Porto reported about his enjoyable trip to McMinnville recently. He announced that the Booneville Flyout is upcoming and to check the Website for details.

Service. Nice job, Wolfgang! Jon encouraged all who do not get the Newsletter Online, to go online and sign up. This saves considerable funds for the Chapter.

Jon also announced that members need to update their info online or otherwise so the new "Blue Book" Roster that comes out in another month or so will be up to date. Old listings will be removed as appropriate

Wolfgang talked about the advertising for the upcoming PAO Open House and that they are expecting a good turnout. There are no problems with the Website. Wolfgang got a note from a person who wants to sell a Taylor Titch aircraft (Wooden construction) on display at the Wings of History Museum. President Jon Garliepp opened the meeting at 7:37pm. Ron Charmichael was absent and Wolfgang Polak took these minutes. He read Ron's minutes from the General Meeting and they were approved unanimously, subject to minor changes.

Randy Wilde gave the treasurer's report. There were no changes from the report given during the General Meeting and the treasurer's report was approved unanimously.

Jon Garliepp listed the positions that need to be filled in the upcoming election. We need candidates for at least the president, the vice president, and one director.

There was nothing to report from the Vice President. Allen Roark stated that he had commitments form 9

pilots to fly Young Eagles during the Palo Alto airport day. He has obtained the necessary insurance certificate and handed it to Carl Honacker. Wolfgang Polak briefed Allen on the special ground frequency and procedures for the airport day.

Allen obtained new Young Eagles flyers from National that show Harrison Ford as the chairman of the program. Allen will be out of town for the Reid Hillview airport day. At that event the chapter will have a booth and do wing rigs but there will be no Young Eagle flights.

The next YE event after the Palo Alto airport day will be at South County airport on October 22nd. Allen is in contact with Paul Marshall, Chapter member and representative of the South County airports association, and with the Wings of History museum.

Jon Garliepp mentioned that past member John Ostrowski contacted him in response to mass mailings done by the Chapter earlier this year.

Brian Dal Porto talked about the Fly-out to Boonville on September 17. The plan is for everyone to meet at the Boonville airport at 11am and then to walk to the fairgrounds.

Paulette Dal Porto discussed deadlines for the newsletter. It was agreed that the newsletter should be mailed to members 10 days before the meeting. The website will be changed to mail minutes to the editor when they are uploaded to the web. There was a general discussion on the formatting and presentation of events listings in the newsletter. It was agreed to use electronic services provided by the US postal service for the mailing of the hardcopy newsletter. This will limit the size of the newsletter to 7 2/3 pages. It was mentioned that the web version of the newsletter could be longer and different from the print version if this becomes necessary.

Wolfgang Polak had no news on the web site except for some complaints due to obsolete browsers that cannot properly render the site. It is still possible to access a simplified version of the site that supports old browsers using <http://www.eaa62.org/old.htm>.

Jack Bowlus had suggested to Jon Garliepp to organize a swap meet together with the Wings of History museum. There was little enthusiasm for the idea.

There was a general discussion about the possibility of hosting a visit of the B-17 next year. Terri Gorman mentioned that Chapter 338 hosted the B-17 some years ago and that the event was a success, financially and otherwise. It was agreed that we would investigate

if it was in possible in principle to host the B-17 at Moffet Field. Assuming that we could get a positive response from NASA we will submit the form to National, due date is October 1. Paulette DalPorto offered to contact NASA.

Allen Roark mentioned that member and former VP Allec Piplani has a broken leg due to a motorcycle accident. Alec still offered to help on the ground at the Palo Alto airport day. In discussing the airport day it was decided that the location of the wing rib setup outside the terminal building was undesirable due to the disruptive helicopter operations in the area. Instead, wing ribs and T-shirt sales will be in the regular vendor area of the event. Young Eagle registration will be inside the terminal building. Wolfgang Polak will work with the Palo Alto Airport Association to ensure suitable space is available in the vendor area.

The meeting adjourned 8:45pm.
